#### Dear Xavier Family,

One of my earliest memories of Xavier comes from the late 80's and early 90's. As a student at St. Mary Catholic, I would eagerly find my way into the Xavier gym for basketball games. When our boys team was good, somehow Xavier was really good. When we were really good, Xavier was great. It was like the one hill we could never climb – and it was made worse by that quirky, demonstrative and accomplished coach who roamed the Xavier sideline, Bob Biebel. Now, almost forty years later, Mr. Biebel is retiring after a storied career in education and as a legendary piece of Xavier history. Who would have guessed that my feelings for him would have changed so significantly? When I was hired as a teacher at Xavier in 1996, I was completely clueless. I knew my theology, but I didn't know anything about classroom management, lesson planning, or basically anything else. In the classroom next door, Mr. Biebel was teaching business (truth be told, I am not sure what he was teaching – but I digress). It was immediately evident that he was far more than a coach. He had such enthusiasm for the students and his colleagues. He was always energetic, always engaging students in questions about life and sports. He invited a group of young teachers to help chaperone his team at the WISAA state basketball tournament as a way of welcoming us to the many Xavier traditions. I can still hear the fans on the "Hawk Walk" and still remember wondering what kind of coaching strategy he was employing when we had the traditional evening meal at the Sizzler!

Fifteen years later, it was Mr. Biebel who convinced me that I was called to a leadership position. He was the president at Lourdes Academy at the time, and he invited me down to interview and to tour the schools in the system. I'd give anything for a video of that afternoon. We strolled the halls and he introduced me to the teachers, stopped to ask individual students about their grades or their attendance, and made a point to celebrate the custodians, secretaries, lunch staff, and all of the other crucial people who too often go overlooked in a school. When we went to the elementary schools, he was mobbed by adoring kids in every classroom. Every single kid knew who he was – Mr. Biebel! – and if he didn't know every single one of them, he sure faked it well. I walked away thinking this was the kind of leader I wanted to work with and I will be forever grateful that he lived up to that standard every single day we worked together at Lourdes. At the end of every day, he would call or come over to my office to check in and ask how he could support me and our staff. I think I grew more over those two years than at any other time in my career.

Finally, life has brought us full circle. For the last several years, as vice-president of advancement, Mr. Biebel has been connecting with parents, alumni and benefactors to secure a future for the school we love. His work is difficult and challenging, yet if you come during the school day, you're just as likely to find him cooking paella with the foods class, talking baseball with the guys in the commons, or sharing his newest kernel of knowledge from a book or documentary. He is fond of telling me that he "watches channels you don't even get" and I promise no truer statement has ever been spoken Join me in congratulating Bob Biebel on a career in service to Catholic education, generations of young people, and especially Xavier. We have been blessed to have him represent us for decades and his leadership will continue to inspire the better angels among us well into the future. Something tells me his retirement will still include plenty of times in the Torchy Gym and the Xavier halls. We will always be privileged to have him. He has left a legacy that few can match.

# **Mock Trial**

The Xavier Mock Trial Team is headed back to state after winning their regional tournament on February 3rd. The state tournament will be held in Madison March 1-3.

Mock Trial is an extracurricular sponsored by the State Bar of Wisconsin allowing high schoolers to get a taste of the legal system. The State Bar provides a fictional case for all Wisconsin students, usually about sixty pages in length, complete with evidence, six witnesses, and relevant Wisconsin law. Each high school divides its team in two, six students on the plaintiff, and six students on the defense. These groups are further divided into three attorneys and three witnesses. Attorneys prepare opening statements, direct and cross-examinations, and closing arguments while the witnesses work to memorize their affidavits so they can spin the case in their side's favor and play their fictional character's role. At tournaments, students compete in four rounds against another school's opposite side of the case, pitting, for example, the Xavier plaintiff against another team's defense.

This year's case involves high school senior Flynn Forrester consuming a hallucinogenic mushroom given to him by his friend, Sam Sargent. However, a few days later, Flynn becomes ill, visiting the hospital with near-lethal amatoxin poisoning. It turns out that Flynn had consumed poisonous mushrooms. Rumors then go around the school and local community that he is a drug dealer, harming his reputation. Flynn Forrester thus brings suit against Sam Sargent on two claims: negligence and defamation. Did Sam Sargent have the responsibility to ensure the mushrooms she gave her friend were safe to consume? Or was it Flynn Forrester's duty to identify the mushrooms? Did Sam Sargent spread defamatory rumors? Or is Flynn Forrester really a covert drug dealer?

Xavier Mock Trial's all-senior team is excited to get one last shot at the state championship and the right to go to the national tournament held in Wilmington, Delaware, this May.


